





- 103.2. Wherever "Fire Code Official" appears in this code, it is defined as the Building Official of the City of Osage Beach or his duly authorized representative.
- 103.2 Wherever "Chief Appointing Authority" appears in this code, it shall read "The Board of Alderman of the City of Osage Beach, Missouri."

Section 5. Section 500.200 2018 International Fire Code Amendments

All references to the International Fuel Gas Code are hereby repealed. The 2018 International Fuel Gas Code shall apply to all installations of natural gas systems and NFPA 54-2018 National Gas Code shall apply to the installation of all propane gas systems.

Section 105.6.32 Open Burning. An operational permit for open fire shall be obtained from the Osage Beach Fire Protection District.

Sections 105.6.48; 105.6.49; 105.6.50; 105.7.2; 105.7.7; 105.7.23 are hereby repealed. Section 110.4 shall be amended as follows:

Section 110.4 Refer to Section 100.190 of the Osage Beach Code of Ordinances Section 507.5.1 is hereby amended to read as follows:

Fire Hydrant: Dry Hydrant, Dry Standpipes, Yard Hydrants, and Public Fire Hydrants shall be installed, located, and protected as directed by the Fire Code Official or his designated representative and shall conform to the material and installation specifications as developed by the City of Osage Beach. The designated threads on all fire hydrants shall be as follows: The steamer connections shall be 4 1/2" and the two other connections shall be 2 ½" and all connections shall be NST.

Installation of other new Fire Hydrants: No person shall install or cause to be installed any fire hydrant within the City of Osage Beach, unless the location thereof, and the design and type of hydrant, including the threads and outlets thereof shall first have been approved by the Fire Code Official.

Placement of Fire Hydrants and Prohibition of obstructing Fire Hydrants: All fire hydrants shall be placed within ten (10) feet of a roadway and not closer than forty (40) feet to any building. Where fire hydrants are to be installed in areas where vehicles would be parked or standing, said vehicle parking or standing should be restricted to ten (10) feet in each direction from the fire hydrant to the center of the public or private passageway. No person shall place a structure within forty (40) feet of a fire hydrant or obstruct or black the use of a hydrant in any manner. Unobstructed access to fire hydrants shall be maintained at all times. The fire department shall not be deterred or hindered from gaining immediate access to fire protection equipment or fire hydrants. Hydrant shall be a minimum of 18" and maximum of 36" off the ground and from grade to center of discharge outlet.

Installation Requirements: Fire Hydrants shall be installed according to the aforesaid plat or development plan, as approved by the Fire Code Official, and that such installation will be made as nearly forthwith as may be practicable. Fire Hydrants shall be installed on water mains not less than six (6) inches in diameter in residential areas of single-family construction and not less than eight (8) inches in diameter in multi-family, commercial, or industrial construction areas. As may be approved by the Fire Code Official hydrants shall be installed at spacing of six hundred feet (600') of separation from hydrant to hydrant, and in other areas including multi-family, commercial and industrial areas, at spacing of three hundred feet (300') from hydrant to hydrant. In cases where special fire hazards exist, such as, but not limited to, buildings or structures where highly combustible materials are stored, used or installed, smaller spacing may be required between fire hydrants, as approved by the Fire Code Official.

Commercial buildings, Condominiums and Multi-Family Occupancies, which have a fire suppression system, must also be served by an approved fire hydrant not further than one hundred fifty feet (150'), in the line of hose path travel, from the fire department connection. All public and private fire hydrant barrels are to be painted red. All fire hydrant bonnets are to be painted as follows to indicate water main size:

COLOR Green, Orange Red WATER MAIN SIZE Fourteen inch (14") or larger Ten inch (10") and twelve inch (12") Six inch (6") and Eight inch (8") System Design: The water supply delivery system shall be designed to deliver water supply according to Appendix B. The system design shall also meet all sprinkler demands. Fire protection systems for all new or remodeled facilities, buildings or portions of buildings hereafter constructed or moved into or within the jurisdiction shall be designed with a 10% safety factor.

Access: The commencement of construction of any such new development, or new building, within the City of Osage Beach, shall be deemed to be the grant of permission by such person for entry upon such property by the water company, or other water supplier, for the installation of any such aforesaid fire hydrant and the water main leading thereto, and also to the City of Osage Beach and the members of its staff and to its equipment, for access to such fire hydrant or hydrants which may be located upon any such property, for any purpose whatever within the function of the district, in consideration of issue of building permits.

All fire hydrants shall be accessible and provide to the fire protection district, at no cost for the water usage, the exercising of hydrants under emergency situations or training and shall further permit testing and record analysis for static and residual pressures and gallons of flow available.

507.5.1.8 Special Conditions. Any hydrant in the opinion of the Fire Code Official that has a special condition the bonnet shall be painted black.

Section 3104.8 Fireworks is hereby amended to read as follows:

Fireworks shall not be used within 300 feet of tents or membrane structures.

Section 5608.1 General. The display of outdoor fireworks shall comply with this chapter and NFPA 1123. The indoor display of fireworks, including proximate audience displays and pyrotechnic special effects in motion picture, television, theatrical, and group entertainment productions shall not be allowed in the City of Osage Beach. Sale or discharge of any fireworks shall comply with section **210.2260 Sale and Discharge Regulations** of the Osage Beach Municipal Code.

Chapter 500 Building Codes and Building Regulations - Article III Property Maintenance Code

Section 500.080 Adoption of the International Property Maintenance Code.

The International Property Maintenance Code, 2018 Edition, is hereby adopted as the existing structures code of the City for the control of buildings and structures within the City. Each and all of the regulations, provisions, penalties, conditions and terms of the code are hereby adopted by reference and made a part of this Article as if fully set out in this Article, with the additions, insertions, deletions and changes, if any, prescribed in Section 500.090. One (1) copy of the International Property Maintenance Code, 2018 Edition, is on file in the office of the City Clerk.

<u>Section 3</u>. That Chapter 500, Article III, SECTION 500.090: 2012 International Property Maintenance Code – Amendments is hereby repealed in its entirety.

<u>Section 4</u>. A new Chapter 500, Article III SECTION 500.090: 2018 International Property Maintenance Code - Amendments is hereby enacted to read as follows:

Section 101.1. These regulations shall be known as the Property Maintenance Code of the City of Osage Beach, Missouri, hereinafter referred to as the Property Maintenance Code or this code.

Section 103.5. Delete in its entirety.

Section 302.4. Insert the words twelve (12) inches.

Section 304.14. Every door, window and other outside opening required for ventilation of habitable rooms, food preparation areas or any areas where products to be included or utilized in food for human consumption are processed, manufactured, packaged or stored shall be supplied with approved tightly fitting screens of minimum of 16 mesh per inch (16 mesh per 25mm), and every screen door used for insect control shall have a self-closing device in good working condition.

Exception: Screens shall not be required where other approved means, such as air

curtains or insect repellent fans, are employed.

Section 602.3. Heat Supply. Every owner and operator of any building who rents, leases or lets one or more dwelling units or sleeping units on terms, either expressed or implied, to furnish heat to the occupants thereof shall supply heat during the period from September 1st to May 1st to maintain a minimum temperature of 68°F (20°C) in all habitable rooms, bathrooms and toilet rooms.

## Exceptions:

- 1. When the outdoor temperature is below the winter outdoor design temperature for the locality, maintenance of the minimum room temperature shall not be required provided that the heating systems is operating at its full design capacity. The winter outdoor design temperature for the locality shall be as indicated in Appendix D of the International Plumbing Code.
- 2. In areas where the average monthly temperature is above 30°F (-1°C) a minimum temperature of 65°F (18°C) shall be maintained.

Section 602.4. Occupiable workspaces. Indoor occupiable workspaces shall be supplied with heat during the period from September 1st to May 1st to maintain a minimum temperature of 65°F (18°C) during the period the spaces are occupied.

#### Exceptions:

- 1. Processing, storage, and operating areas that required cooling or special temperature conditions.
- 2. Areas in which persons are primarily engaged in vigorous physical activity.

## **Department Comments and Recommendation:**

The project was bid out in early April. The bid opening was on April 22nd. The City received 3 bids. The bid tab is attached. The low bidder was Stockman Construction with a bid of \$107,465.00. The budget for this project is \$109,000. The City has worked with this contractor multiple times in the past with good results. Most recently they completed the Mace Road Phase 2B improvements. I also checked there references and found no problems.

This contract includes the removal of existing features along Wren Lane and the construction of approximately 428 feet of new 18 foot wide road with a cul-de-sac (Includes grading) We will also be moving a utility electrical meter rack that does not currently meet Ameren UE's compliance standards and making some other minor utility adjustments.

Alternate #1 is for paving 10 feet of new driveway for 4 homes on Wren Lane. This will allow for a smoother transition from the paved road to gravel driveways.

Including Alternate #1 means that we will not need the Gravel Driveway Repair (6" thick) item listed in the base bid. \$109,707.50 - \$2,242.50 = \$107,465.00.

## **City Administrator Comments:**

The request is to award the engineering services (preliminary and construction engineering) to Anderson Inc. for the Osage Beach Parkway Extension to Executive Drive project, in an amount not to exceed \$74,080. This budgeted FY2021 project although likely the constructions portion o0f the project will carryover into FY2022, based on the approved project and Cost Share grant timeline by MoDOT.

The project was approved by the Missouri Highway and Transportation Commission Cost Share Program the Board acceptance in January 2021.

The Cost Share Program will fund up to \$199,395 in total. Eligible preliminary and construction engineering approved through the program of up to \$74,096 (part of the total program funding). The OBSRD (Osage Beach Special Road District) has committed \$100,000 funding for the total project as well.

Anderson Engineering Inc. was selected from the Missouri Highway and Transportation Commission's addition to their experience and expertise.

THIS CONTRACT is between City of Osage Beach, Missouri, hereinafter referred to as the "Local Agency", and Anderson Engineering, Inc. 4240 Philips Farm Rd Suite 101, Columbia, MO 65201, hereinafter referred to as the "Engineer".

INASMUCH as funds have been made available by the Federal Highway Administration through its Commission's Cost Share Program, coordinated through the Missouri Department of Transportation, the Local Agency intends to Extend Osage Beach Parkway to Executive Drive and requires professional engineering services. The Engineer will provide the Local Agency with professional services hereinafter detailed for the planning, design and construction inspection of the desired improvements and the Local Agency will pay the Engineer as provided in this contract. It is mutually agreed as follows:

## ARTICLE I – SCOPE OF SERVICES

See Attachment A for the Scope of Services specific to this project.

## ARTICLE II - DISADVANTAGED BUSINESS ENTERPRISE (DBE) REQUIREMENTS:

- A. DBE Goal: The following DBE goal has been established for this Agreement. The dollar value of services and related equipment, supplies, and materials used in furtherance thereof which is credited toward this goal will be based on the amount actually paid to DBE firms. The goal for the percentage of services to be awarded to DBE firms is 5% of the total Agreement dollar value.
- B. DBE Participation Obtained by Engineer: The Engineer has obtained DBE participation, and agrees to use DBE firms to complete, <u>7.6</u>% of the total services to be performed under this Agreement, by dollar value. The DBE firms which the Engineer shall use, and the type and dollar value of the services each DBE will perform, is as follows:

#### ARTICLE III-ADDITIONAL SERVICES

The Local Agency reserves the right to request additional work, and changed or unforeseen conditions may require changes and work beyond the scope of this contract. In this event, a supplement to this agreement shall be executed and submitted for the approval of MoDOT prior to performing the additional or changed work or incurring any additional cost thereof. Any change in compensation will be covered in the supplement.

## ARTICLE IV - RESPONSIBILITIES OF LOCAL AGENCY

The Local Agency will cooperate fully with the Engineer in the development of the project, including the following:

- A. make available all information pertaining to the project which may be in the possession of the Local Agency;
- B. provide the Engineer with the Local Agency's requirements for the project;
- C. make provisions for the Engineer to enter upon property at the project site for the performance of his duties;
- D. examine all studies and layouts developed by the Engineer, obtain reviews by MoDOT, and render decisions thereon in a prompt manner so as not to delay the Engineer;
- E. designate a Local Agency's employee to act as Local Agency's Person in Responsible Charge under this contract, such person shall have authority to transmit instructions, interpret the Local Agency's policies and render decisions with respect to matters covered by this agreement (see EPG 136.3);
- F. perform appraisals and appraisal review, negotiate with property owners and otherwise provide all services in connection with acquiring all right-of-way needed to construct this project.

#### ARTICLE V - PERIOD OF SERVICE

The Engineer will commence work within two weeks after receiving notice to proceed from the Local Agency. The general phases of work will be completed in accordance with the following schedule:

- A. PS&E Approval by MODOT shall be completed on May 1, 2022.
- B. Construction Phase shall be completed 60 days after construction final completion schedule.

The Local Agency will grant time extensions for delays due to unforeseeable causes beyond the control of and without fault or negligence of the Engineer. Requests for extensions of time shall be made in writing by the Engineer, before that phase of work is scheduled to be completed, stating fully the events giving rise to the request and justification for the time extension requested.

#### ARTICLE VI – STANDARDS

The Engineer shall be responsible for working with the Local Agency in determining the appropriate design parameters and construction specifications for the project using good engineering judgment based on the specific site conditions, Local Agency needs, and guidance provided in the most current version of EPG 136 LPA Policy. If the project is on the state highway system or is a bridge project, then the latest version of MoDOT's Engineering Policy Guide (EPG) and Missouri Standard Specifications for Highway Construction shall be used (see EPG 136.7). The project plans must also be in compliance with the latest ADA (Americans with Disabilities Act) Regulations.

#### ARTICLE VII - COMPENSATION

For services provided under this contract, the Local Agency will compensate the Engineer as follows:

- A. For design services, including work through the construction contract award stage, the Local Agency will pay the Engineer the actual costs incurred plus a predetermined fixed fee of \$4,482.77, with a ceiling established for said design services in the amount of \$42,750.00, which amount shall not be exceeded.
- B. For construction inspection services, the Local Agency will pay the Engineer the actual costs incurred plus a predetermined fixed fee of \$ 3,546.01, with a ceiling established for said inspection services in the amount of \$ 31,330.00, which amount shall not be exceeded.
- C. The compensation outlined above has been derived from estimates of cost which are detailed in Attachment B. Any major changes in work, extra work, exceeding of the contract ceiling, or change in the predetermined fixed fee will require a supplement to this contract, as covered in Article III ADDITIONAL SERVICES.
- D. Actual costs in Sections A and B above are defined as:
  - 1. Actual payroll salaries paid to employees for time that they are productively engaged in work covered by this contract, plus
  - 2. An amount calculated at 28% of actual salaries in Item 1 above for payroll additives, including payroll taxes, holiday and vacation pay, sick leave pay, insurance benefits, retirement and incentive pay, plus
  - 3. An amount calculated at 117% of actual salaries in Item 1 above for general administrative overhead, based on the Engineer's system for allocating indirect costs in accordance with sound accounting principles and business practice, plus
  - 4. Other costs directly attributable to the project but not included in the above overhead, such as vehicle mileage, meals and lodging, printing, surveying expendables, and computer time, plus

- 5. Project costs incurred by others on a subcontract basis, said costs to be passed through the Engineer on the basis of reasonable and actual cost as invoiced by the subcontractors.
- E. The rates shown for additives and overhead in Sections VII. D.2 and VII. D.3 above are the established Engineer's overhead rate accepted at the time of contract execution and shall be utilized throughout the life of this contract for billing purposes.
- F. The payment of costs under this contract will be limited to costs which are allowable under 23 CFR 172 and 48 CFR 31.
- G. METHOD OF PAYMENT - Partial payments for work satisfactorily completed will be made to the Engineer upon receipt of itemized invoices by the Local Agency. Invoices will be submitted no more frequently than once every two weeks and must be submitted monthly for invoices greater than \$10,000. A pro-rated portion of the fixed fee will be paid with each Upon receipt of the invoice and progress report, the Local Agency will, as soon as practical, but not later than 45 days from receipt, pay the Engineer for the services rendered, including the proportion of the fixed fee earned as reflected by the estimate of the portion of the services completed as shown by the progress report, less partial payments previously made. A late payment charge of one and one half percent (1.5%) per month shall be assessed for those invoiced amount not paid, through no fault of the Engineer, within 45 days after the Local Agency's receipt of the Engineer's invoice. The Local Agency will not be liable for the late payment charge on any invoice which requests payment for costs which exceed the proportion of the maximum amount payable earned as reflected by the estimate of the portion of the services completed, as shown by the progress report. The payment, other than the fixed fee, will be subject to final audit of actual expenses during the period of the Agreement.
- H. **PROPERTY ACCOUNTABILITY** If it becomes necessary to acquire any specialized equipment for the performance of this contract, appropriate credit will be given for any residual value of said equipment after completion of usage of the equipment.

## ARTICLE VIII - COVENANT AGAINST CONTINGENT FEES

The Engineer warrants that he has not employed or retained any company or person, other than a bona fide employee working for the Engineer, to solicit or secure this agreement, and that he has not paid or agreed to pay any company or person, other than a bona fide employee, any fee, commission, percentage, brokerage fee, gifts, or any other consideration, contingent upon or resulting from the award or making of this contract. For breach or violation of this warranty, the Local Agency shall have the right to annul this agreement without liability, or in its discretion to deduct from the contract price or consideration, or otherwise recover, the full amount of such fee, commission, percentage, brokerage fee, gift, or contingent fee, plus reasonable attorney's fees.

## ARTICLE IX - SUBLETTING, ASSIGNMENT OR TRANSFER

No portion of the work covered by this contract, except as provided herein, shall be sublet or transferred without the written consent of the Local Agency. The subletting of the work shall in no way relieve the Engineer of his primary responsibility for the quality and performance of the work. It is the intention of the Engineer to engage subcontractors for the purposes of:

#### ARTICLE X - PROFESSIONAL ENDORSEMENT

All plans, specifications and other documents shall be endorsed by the Engineer and shall reflect the name and seal of the Professional Engineer endorsing the work. By signing and sealing the PS&E submittals the Engineer of Record will be representing to MoDOT that the design is meeting the intent of the federal aid programs.

#### ARTICLE XI - RETENTION OF RECORDS

The Engineer shall maintain all records, survey notes, design documents, cost and accounting records, construction records and other records pertaining to this contract and to the project covered by this contract, for a period of not less than three years following final payment by FHWA. Said records shall be made available for inspection by authorized representatives of the Local Agency, MoDOT or the federal government during regular working hours at the Engineer's place of business.

## ARTICLE XII - OWNERSHIP OF DOCUMENTS

Plans, tracings, maps and specifications prepared under this contract shall be delivered to and become the property of the Local Agency upon termination or completion of work. Basic survey notes, design computations and other data prepared under this contract shall be made available to the Local Agency upon request. All such information produced under this contract shall be available for use by the Local Agency without restriction or limitation on its use. If the Local Agency incorporates any portion of the work into a project other than that for which it was performed, the Local Agency shall save the Engineer harmless from any claims and liabilities resulting from such use.

#### ARTICLE XIII – SUSPENSION OR TERMINATION OF AGREEMENT

- A. The Local Agency may, without being in breach hereof, suspend or terminate the Engineer's services under this Agreement, or any part of them, for cause or for the convenience of the Local Agency, upon giving to the Engineer at least fifteen (15) days' prior written notice of the effective date thereof. The Engineer shall not accelerate performance of services during the fifteen (15) day period without the express written request of the Local Agency.
- B. Should the Agreement be suspended or terminated for the convenience of the Local Agency, the Local Agency will pay to the Engineer its costs as set forth in Attachment B including actual hours expended prior to such suspension or termination and direct costs as defined in this

Agreement for services performed by the Engineer, a proportional amount of the fixed fee based upon an estimated percentage of Agreement completion, plus reasonable costs incurred by the Engineer in suspending or terminating the services. The payment will make no other allowances for damages or anticipated fees or profits. In the event of a suspension of the services, the Engineer's compensation and schedule for performance of services hereunder shall be equitably adjusted upon resumption of performance of the services.

- C. The Engineer shall remain liable to the Local Agency for any claims or damages occasioned by any failure, default, or negligent errors and/or omission in carrying out the provisions of this Agreement during its life, including those giving rise to a termination for non-performance or breach by Engineer. This liability shall survive and shall not be waived, or estopped by final payment under this Agreement.
- D. The Engineer shall not be liable for any errors or omissions contained in deliverables which are incomplete as a result of a suspension or termination where the Engineer is deprived of the opportunity to complete the Engineer's services.
- E. Upon the occurrence of any of the following events, the Engineer may suspend performance hereunder by giving the Local Agency 30 days advance written notice and may continue such suspension until the condition is satisfactorily remedied by the Local Agency. In the event the condition is not remedied within 120 days of the Engineer's original notice, the Engineer may terminate this agreement.
  - 1. Receipt of written notice from the Local Agency that funds are no longer available to continue performance.
  - 2. The Local Agency's persistent failure to make payment to the Engineer in a timely manner.
  - 3. Any material contract breach by the Local Agency.

## ARTICLE XIV - DECISIONS UNDER THIS CONTRACT

The Local Agency will determine the acceptability of work performed under this contract, and will decide all questions which may arise concerning the project. The Local Agency's decision shall be final and conclusive.

## ARTICLE XV - SUCCESSORS AND ASSIGNS

The Local Agency and the Engineer agree that this contract and all contracts entered into under the provisions of this contract shall be binding upon the parties hereto and their successors and assigns.

## **ARTICLE XVI - COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS**

The Engineer shall comply with all federal, state, and local laws, ordinances, and regulations applicable to the work, including but not limited to Title VI and Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, as

amended (42 U.S.C. 2000d, 2000e), as well as with any applicable titles of the Americans with Disabilities Act (42 U.S.C. 12101, et seq.) and non-discrimination clauses incorporated herein, and shall procure all licenses and permits necessary for the fulfillment of obligations under this contract.

#### ARTICLE XVII - RESPONSIBILITY FOR CLAIMS AND LIABILITY

The Engineer agrees to save harmless the Local Agency, MoDOT and FHWA from all claims and liability due to his negligent acts or the negligent acts of his employees, agents or subcontractors.

## ARTICLE XVIII - NONDISCRIMINATION

The Engineer, with regard to the work performed by it after award and prior to completion of the contract work, will not discriminate on the ground of race, color or national origin in the selection and retention of subcontractors. The Engineer will comply with state and federal related to nondiscrimination, including but not limited to Title VI and Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, as amended (42 U.S.C. 2000d, 2000e), as well as with any applicable titles of the Americans with Disabilities Act (42 U.S.C. 12101, et seq.). More specifically, the Engineer will comply with the regulations of the Department of Transportation relative to nondiscrimination in federally assisted programs of the Department of Transportation, as contained in 49 CFR 21 through Appendix H and 23 CFR 710.405 which are herein incorporated by reference and made a part of this contract. In all solicitations either by competitive bidding or negotiation made by the Engineer for work to be performed under a subcontract, including procurements of materials or equipment, each potential subcontractor or supplier shall be notified by the Engineer's obligations under this contract and the regulations relative to non-discrimination on the ground of color, race or national origin.

#### ARTICLE XIX – LOBBY CERTIFICATION

<u>CERTIFICATION ON LOBBYING</u>: Since federal funds are being used for this agreement, the Engineer's signature on this agreement constitutes the execution of all certifications on lobbying which are required by 49 C.F.R. Part 20 including Appendix A and B to Part 20. Engineer agrees to abide by all certification or disclosure requirements in 49 C.F.R. Part 20 which are incorporated herein by reference.

## ARTICLE XX - INSURANCE

- A. The Engineer shall maintain commercial general liability, automobile liability, and worker's compensation and employer's liability insurance in full force and effect to protect the Engineer from claims under Worker's Compensation Acts, claims for damages for personal injury or death, and for damages to property arising from the negligent acts, errors, or omissions of the Engineer and its employees, agents, and Subconsultants in the performance of the services covered by this Agreement, including, without limitation, risks insured against in commercial general liability policies.
- B. The Engineer shall also maintain professional liability insurance to protect the Engineer against the negligent acts, errors, or omissions of the Engineer and those for whom it is legally responsible, arising out of the performance of professional services under this Agreement.

- C. The Engineer's insurance coverage shall be for not less than the following limits of liability:
  - 1. Commercial General Liability: \$500,000 per person up to \$3,000,000 per occurrence;
  - 2. Automobile Liability: \$500,000 per person up to \$3,000,000 per occurrence:
  - 3. Worker's Compensation in accordance with the statutory limits; and Employer's Liability: \$1,000,000; and
  - 4. Professional ("Errors and Omissions") Liability: \$1,000,000, each claim and in the annual aggregate.
- D. The Engineer shall, upon request at any time, provide the Local Agency with certificates of insurance evidencing the Engineer's commercial general or professional liability ("Errors and Omissions") policies and evidencing that they and all other required insurance are in effect as to the services under this Agreement.
- E. Any insurance policy required as specified in (ARTICLE XX) shall be written by a company which is incorporated in the United States of America or is based in the United States of America. Each insurance policy must be issued by a company authorized to issue such insurance in the State of Missouri.

#### ATTACHMENT A

## **Scope of Services**

## **A. DESIGN PHASE** - The Engineer will:

- 1. determine the needs of the Local Agency for the project. Local Agency has the right to not work with a particular individual on the AE team should they become unsatisfactory on the project, and AE will assign a new individual;
- 2. conduct topographic, property and utility surveys sufficient to develop plans for the project;
- 3. arrange for subsurface investigations, if needed;
- 4. conduct hydraulic studies, prepare alternative designs and cost estimates, develop preliminary plans, and recommend to the Local Agency the best overall general design based on these studies;
- 5. submit electronic copies of preliminary/right-of-way plans, estimates and studies for review by the Local Agency and the Missouri Department of Transportation (MoDOT);
- 6. prepare detailed construction plans, cost estimates, specifications and related documents as necessary for the purpose of soliciting bids for constructing the project;
- 7. secure adequate property title information, determine right-of-way requirements, prepare right-of-way plans, and assist the Local Agency in acquiring donated right-of-way deeds needed for the project; if deemed necessary, arrange to have right-of-way appraisals and purchase negotiations with land owners conducted on a subcontract/supplemental agreement basis.
- 8. ensure compliance with water quality requirements by coordinating with the Missouri Department of Natural Resources and the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers and also insure compliance with the requirements of the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA); if deemed necessary, arrange to have the site examined by a qualified professional to determine wetlands impact on a subcontract/supplemental agreement basis. Engineer cost to arrange for site examination and subcontractor cost of determining wetlands impact are not included in this contract. A Supplemental Agreement for Engineer cost and subcontractor cost will be issued if wetlands determination is deemed necessary.
- 9. ensure compliance with historic preservation requirements through coordination with the Missouri Department of Natural Resources; if deemed necessary, arrange to have the site examined by a qualified archaeologist on a subcontract/supplemental agreement basis. Engineer cost to arrange for archaeological investigation and subcontractor cost of archaeological investigation are not included in this contract. A Supplemental Agreement for Engineer cost and subcontractor cost will be issued if archaeological investigation is deemed necessary.

- 10. prepare permit applications for other permits which may apply to this project such as Farmland Conversion and Endangered Species permits;
- 11. ensure compliance with all regulations in regards to noise abatement and air quality, if necessary;
- 12. provide the Local Agency with electronic sets of completed plans, specifications and cost estimates for the purpose of obtaining construction authorization from the Missouri Department of Transportation; and
- 13. arrange for hazardous waste inspection, other than asbestos and lead paint already included, if required; if deemed necessary, arrange for hazardous waste inspection and/or abatement by a qualified professional on a subcontract/supplemental agreement basis. Engineer cost to arrange for abatement and subcontractor cost of inspection and/or abatement are not included in this contract. Supplemental Agreements for Engineer cost and subcontractor cost will be issued if hazardous waste inspection and/or abatement is deemed necessary.

## **B. BIDDING PHASE** - The Engineer will:

- 1. upon receipt of construction authorization from MoDOT, make final corrections resulting from reviews by agencies involved, and provide an adequate number of plans, specifications, and bid documents to the Local Agency;
- 2. provide the Local Agency with a list of qualified area bidders and assist Local Agency in advertising for bids; and
- 3. assist the Local Agency in evaluating bids and requesting concurrence in award from MoDOT;

## C. CONSTRUCTION PHASE - The Engineer will:

serve as the Local Agency's representative for administering the terms of the construction contract between Local Agency and their Contractor. Engineer will endeavor to protect the Local Agency against defects and deficiencies in workmanship and materials in work by the Contractor. However, the furnishing of such project representation will not make Engineer responsible for the construction methods and procedures used by the Contractor or for the Contractor's failure to perform work in accordance with the contract documents. Engineer's services will include more specifically as follows:

- 1. assist the Local Agency with a preconstruction conference to discuss project details with the Contractor;
- 2. make daily site visits to observe the Contractor's progress and quality of work, and to determine if the work conforms to the contract documents. It is contemplated that survey staking and layout will be accomplished by the contractor's forces. The Engineer will accompany MoDOT and FHWA representatives on visits of the project site as requested;
- 3. check shop drawings and review schedules and drawings submitted by the Contractor;

- 4. recommend rejection of work not conforming to the project documents;
- 5. prepare change orders for issuance by the Local Agency as necessary and assure that proper approvals are made prior to work being performed;
- 6. review wage rates, postings, equal employment opportunity and other related items called for in the contract documents;
- 7. inspect materials, review material certifications furnished by Contractor, sample concrete and other materials as required, and arrange for laboratory testing of samples by others on a subcontract basis. Independent assurance samples and tests will be performed by MoDOT personnel and such sampling and testing is excluded from the work to be performed by the Engineer under this contract;
- 8. maintain progress diary and other project records, measure and document quantities, and review monthly estimates for payments due the Contractor;
- 9. be present during critical construction operations, including but not limited to the following:
  - a. excavation and backfilling;
- b. checking of reinforcing steel prior to concrete placement;
- c. concrete pouring;
- d. placement of surfacing materials; and
- e. participate in final inspection, provide the Local Agency with project documentation (diaries, test results, certifications, etc.), and provide as-constructed plans for the Local Agency's records.

The knowledge and information of a participant is not required to exceed that which normally possessed by a prudent person in the ordinary course of business dealings.
- 9. Except for transactions authorized under paragraph 5 of these instructions, if a participant in a covered transaction knowingly enters into a lower tier covered transaction with a person who is suspended,

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debarred, ineligible, or voluntarily excluded from participation in this transaction, in addition to other remedies available to the Federal Government, the department or agency with which this transaction originated may pursue available remedies, including suspension and/or debarment.

## Certification Regarding Debarment, Suspension, Ineligibility and Voluntary Exclusion--Lower Tier Covered Transactions

- 1. The prospective lower tier participant certifies, by submission of this proposal, that neither it nor its principals is presently debarred, suspended, proposed for debarment, declared ineligible, or voluntarily excluded from participation in this transaction by any Federal department or agency.
- 2. Where the prospective lower tier participant is unable to certify to any of the statements in this certification, such prospective participant shall attach an explanation to this proposal.

#### ATTACHMENT E

#### DISADVANTAGE BUSINESS ENTERPRISE CONTRACT PROVISIONS

- 1. <u>Policy</u>: It is the policy of the U.S. Department of Transportation and the Local Agency that businesses owned by socially and economically disadvantaged individuals (DBE's) as defined in 49 C.F.R. Part 26 have the maximum opportunity to participate in the performance of contracts financed in whole or in part with federal funds. Thus, the requirements of 49 C.F.R. Part 26 and Section 1101(b) of the Transportation Equity Act for the 21st Century (TEA-21) apply to this Agreement.
- 2. <u>Obligation of the Engineer to DBE's</u>: The Engineer agrees to assure that DBEs have the maximum opportunity to participate in the performance of this Agreement and any subconsultant agreement financed in whole or in part with federal funds. In this regard the Engineer shall take all necessary and reasonable steps to assure that DBEs have the maximum opportunity to compete for and perform services. The Engineer shall not discriminate on the basis of race, color, religion, creed, disability, sex, age, or national origin in the performance of this Agreement or in the award of any subsequent subconsultant agreement.
- 3. <u>Geographic Area for Solicitation of DBEs</u>: The Engineer shall seek DBEs in the same geographic area in which the solicitation for other subconsultants is made. If the Engineer cannot meet the DBE goal using DBEs from that geographic area, the Engineer shall, as a part of the effort to meet the goal, expand the search to a reasonably wider geographic area.
- 4. <u>Determination of Participation Toward Meeting the DBE Goal</u>: DBE participation shall be counted toward meeting the goal as follows:
  - A. Once a firm is determined to be a certified DBE, the total dollar value of the subconsultant agreement awarded to that DBE is counted toward the DBE goal set forth above.
  - B. The Engineer may count toward the DBE goal a portion of the total dollar value of a subconsultant agreement with a joint venture eligible under the DBE standards, equal to the percentage of the ownership and control of the DBE partner in the joint venture.
  - C. The Engineer may count toward the DBE goal expenditures to DBEs who perform a commercially useful function in the completion of services required in this Agreement. A DBE is considered to perform a commercially useful function when the DBE is responsible for the execution of a distinct element of the services specified in the Agreement and the carrying out of those responsibilities by actually performing, managing and supervising the services involved and providing the desired product.
  - D. A Engineer may count toward the DBE goal its expenditures to DBE firms consisting of fees or commissions charged for providing a bona fide service, such as professional, technical, consultant, or managerial services and assistance in the procurement of essential personnel, facilities, equipment, materials or supplies required for the performance of this Agreement, provided that the fee or commission is determined by MoDOT's External Civil Rights Division to be reasonable and not excessive as compared with fees customarily allowed for similar services.
  - E. The Engineer is encouraged to use the services of banks owned and controlled by socially and economically disadvantaged individuals.
- 5. Replacement of DBE Subconsultants: The Engineer shall make good faith efforts to replace a DBE

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Subconsultant, who is unable to perform satisfactorily, with another DBE Subconsultant. Replacement firms must be approved by MoDOT's External Civil Rights Division.

6. <u>Verification of DBE Participation</u>: Prior to final payment by the Local Agency, the Engineer shall file a list with the Local Agency showing the DBEs used and the services performed. The list shall show the actual dollar amount paid to each DBE that is applicable to the percentage participation established in this Agreement. Failure on the part of the Engineer to achieve the DBE participation specified in this Agreement may result in sanctions being imposed on the Commission for noncompliance with 49 C.F.R. Part 26 and/or Section 1101(b) of TEA-21. If the total DBE participation is less than the goal amount stated by the MoDOT's External Civil Rights Division, liquidated damages may be assessed to the Engineer.

Therefore, in order to liquidate such damages, the monetary difference between the amount of the DBE goal dollar amount and the amount actually paid to the DBEs for performing a commercially useful function will be deducted from the Engineer's payments as liquidated damages. If this Agreement is awarded with less than the goal amount stated above by MoDOT's External Civil Rights Division, that lesser amount shall become the goal amount and shall be used to determine liquidated damages. No such deduction will be made when, for reasons beyond the control of the Engineer, the DBE goal amount is not met.

- 7. Documentation of Good Faith Efforts to Meet the DBE Goal: The Agreement goal is established by MoDOT's External Civil Rights Division. The Engineer must document the good faith efforts it made to achieve that DBE goal, if the agreed percentage specified is less than the percentage stated. The Good Faith Efforts documentation shall illustrate reasonable efforts to obtain DBE Participation. Good faith efforts to meet this DBE goal amount may include such items as, but are not limited to, the following:
  - A. Attended a meeting scheduled by the Department to inform DBEs of contracting or consulting opportunities.
  - B. Advertised in general circulation trade association and socially and economically disadvantaged business directed media concerning DBE subcontracting opportunities.
  - C. Provided written notices to a reasonable number of specific DBEs that their interest in a subconsultant agreement is solicited in sufficient time to allow the DBEs to participate effectively.
  - D. Followed up on initial solicitations of interest by contacting DBEs to determine with certainty whether the DBEs were interested in subconsulting work for this Agreement.
  - E. Selected portions of the services to be performed by DBEs in order to increase the likelihood of meeting the DBE goal (including, where appropriate, breaking down subconsultant agreements into economically feasible units to facilitate DBE participation).
  - F. Provided interested DBEs with adequate information about plans, specifications and requirements of this Agreement.
  - G. Negotiated in good faith with interested DBEs, and not rejecting DBEs as unqualified without sound reasons, based on a thorough investigation of their capabilities.
  - H. Made efforts to assist interested DBEs in obtaining any bonding, lines of credit or insurance required by the Commission or by the Engineer.

- I.Made effective use of the services of available disadvantaged business organizations, minority contractors' groups, disadvantaged business assistance offices, and other organizations that provide assistance in the recruitment and placement of DBE firms.
- 8. <u>Good Faith Efforts to Obtain DBE Participation</u>: If the Engineer's agreed DBE goal amount as specified is less than the established DBE goal given, then the Engineer certifies that good faith efforts were taken by Engineer in an attempt to obtain the level of DBE participation set by MoDOT's External Civil Rights.

<u>Section 4</u>. Repeal of Ordinances not to affect liabilities, etc.

Whenever any part of this ordinance shall be repealed or modified, either expressly or by implication, by a subsequent ordinance, that part of the ordinance thus repealed or modified shall continue in force until the subsequent ordinance repealing or modifying the ordinance shall go into effect unless therein otherwise expressly provided; but no suit, prosecution, proceeding, right, fine or penalty instituted, created, given, secured or accrued under this ordinance previous to its repeal shall not be affected, released or discharged but may be prosecuted, enjoined and recovered as fully as if this ordinance or provisions had continued in force, unless it shall be therein otherwise expressly provided.

<u>Section 5</u>. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage by the Board of Aldermen and approval by the Mayor.

#### Introduction

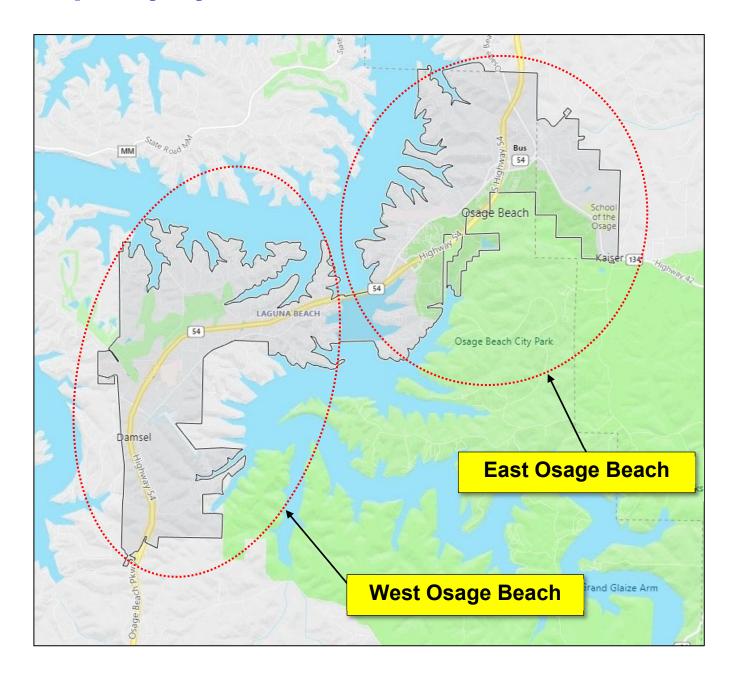
The City of Osage Beach Sidewalk Master Plan analyzes and prioritizes future sidewalk projects where gaps exist. The plan identifies projects for which grant funding applications could be made, and assists in making capital budget decisions by identifying the most critical sidewalk improvement and construction locations throughout the City of Osage Beach. Additionally, this document informs the public of the City's priorities regarding future sidewalk construction projects.

There are numerous roads in the City of Osage Beach which lack sidewalks, and the major roadways lacking sidewalks present the greatest need. Many of these are especially critical for pedestrians, as they provide the connectivity that the local roadways do not. In recognition of these needs, the majority of the sidewalk projects contained in this Plan are on the City's major roadway system. These proposed sidewalk projects are considered a priority due to their greater connectivity to existing sidewalks, larger vehicular traffic volumes, pedestrian safety concerns, and destination locations.

## This is a 15-year conceptual plan and contains a total of 23 projects, with an estimated cost of over \$15M.

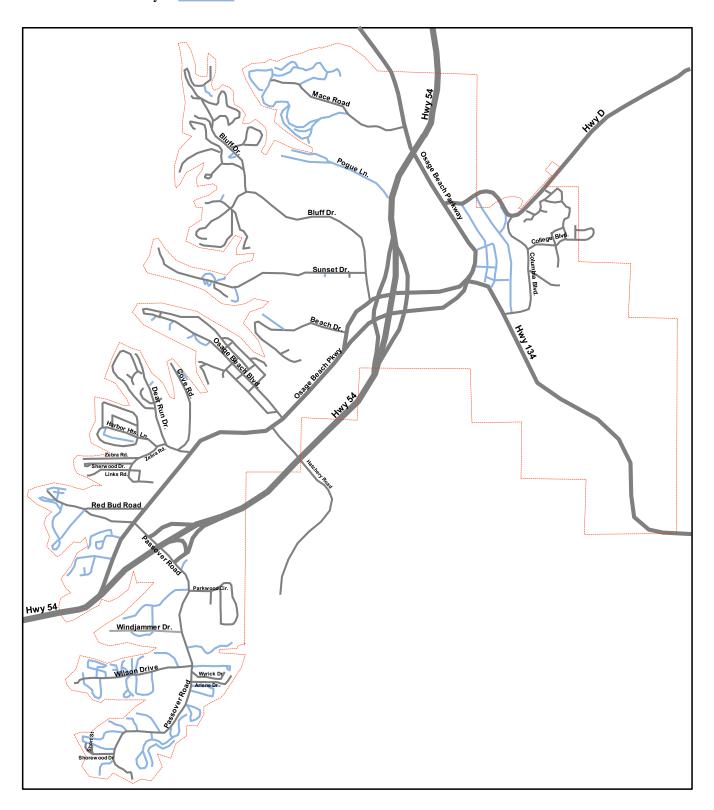



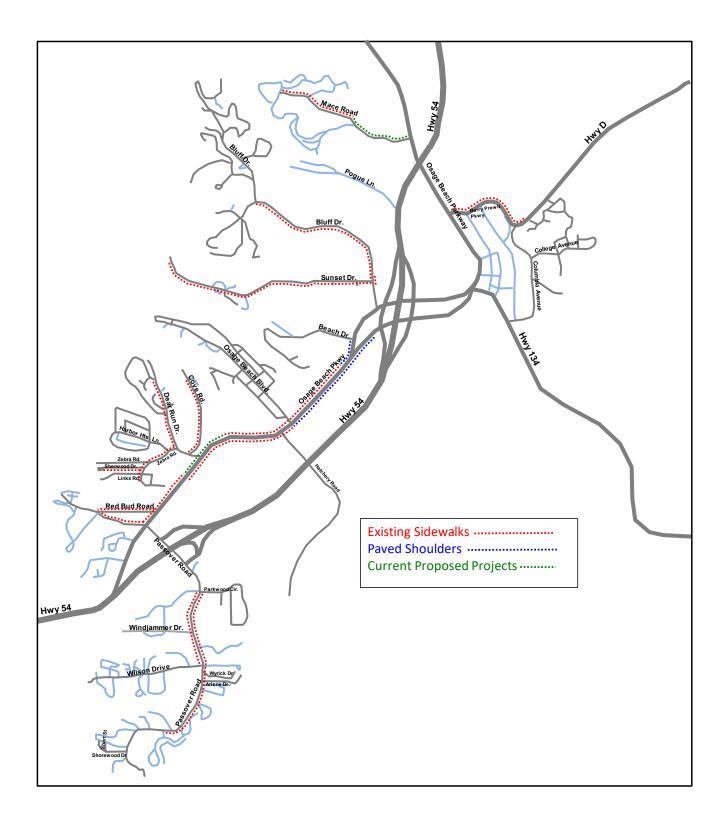




### Map Showing Existing Sidewalks and Paved Shoulders - East Osage Beach



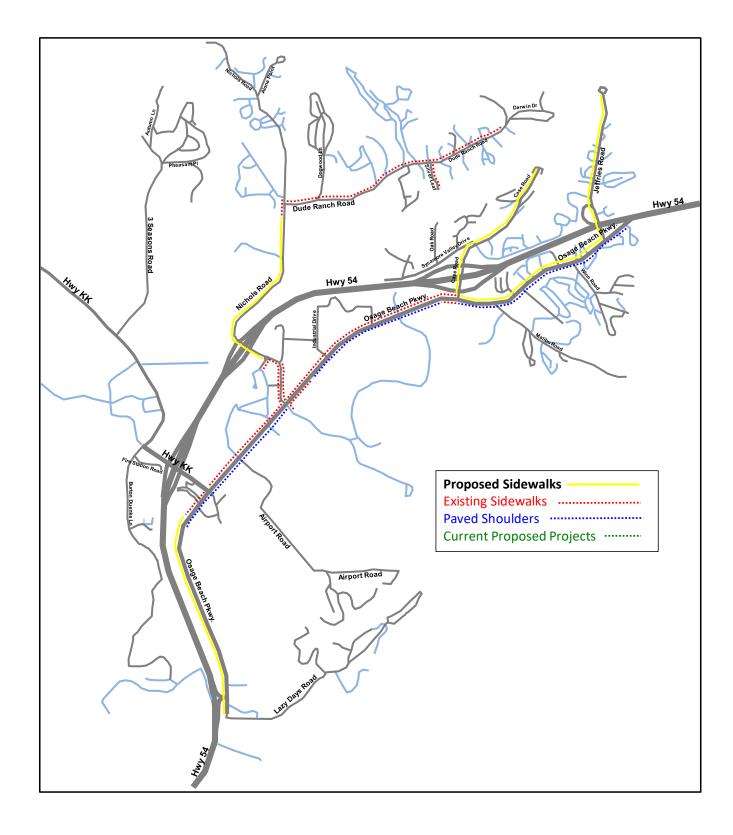
### Map Showing Proposed Sidewalks - East Osage Beach





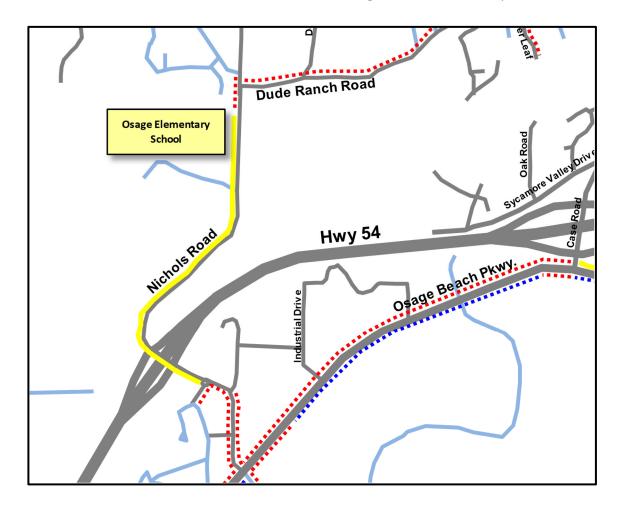

Enclosed is my memo outlining the estimated adjusted Jan 1, 2021 cash and

equivalent balances based on the FY2020 Financial Statements audit draft, a reserve balance update, and a summary and forecast of the City's outstanding debt.

The FY2020 Financial Statements audit work is complete and a draft report has been received. Based on said draft, I have reconciled our beginning balances for FY2021.

Overall, with the exception of one fund, beginning balances were higher than estimated during the budget process last fall. This was due to a combination of both FY2020 revenue collections coming in higher estimated and FY2020 expenditures lower than estimated during the budget process. Reserve balances as budgeted in FY2021 had little to no change.

The City Debt Summary and Forecast is enclosed in the report for complete information on outstanding debt and debt service costs associated with each debt item. Based on past conversations with the Mayor and Board of Aldermen, there was interest in further conversations regarding any opportunities for us to pay debt off early to save on debt service costs.

**Reserve Funds Update** 

**Debt Summary and Forecast** 

The following is an FY2021 Operating Budget update as of April 30, 2021. The FY2020 Financial Statement audit work has been completed and final document is pending in draft form; however, I have used the draft version, pending any last-minute changes, in my report below.

Please note, during the FY2021 budget process in the fall of 2020, revenue and expenditure estimations for the final months of FY2020 are needed to outline the spending plan for FY2021 as adopted in December. These estimations are based on current spending and unaudited financial data. The following is a summary of the FY2021 beginning cash and investments available, adjusted per the FY2020 audit draft and factors that contributed to the increases/decreases.

#### **General Fund – 10:**

- Beginning balances for FY2021 were +15%; adjusted net estimated unrestricted spending available at year-end FY2021 is \$265,000 +/-; an increase of \$265,000+/- from budget.
  - Additional incoming revenues in FY2020 related to COVID contributed to nearly \$100,000 of the increase.
  - FY2020 expenditures came in lower than estimated during the budget process.
- Through April 2021, 31.9% of budgeted revenues and 30.3% of budgeted expenditures have been realized.

#### Capital Improvement Fund – 19

- Beginning balances for FY2021 were <3%>; adjusted net estimated unrestricted spending available year-end FY2021 is \$1.3 million +/-; a decrease of \$6,700+/- from budget.
  - FY2020 expenditures came in higher than estimated due directly to required TIF transfers due to the increase in sales tax revenue within the TIF districts.
- Through April 2021, 30.1% of budgeted revenues and 30.3% of budgeted expenditures have been realized.

### **Transportation Fund – 20:**

- Beginning balances for FY2021 were +6%; adjusted net estimated unrestricted spending available year-end FY2021 is \$478,000+/-; an increase of \$253,000+/- from budget.
  - FY2020 revenues came in higher, and FY2020 expenditures came in lower than estimated during the budget process.
- Through April 2021, 24.2% of budgeted revenues and 12.8% of budgeted expenditures have been realized.

#### Water Fund – 30:

- Beginning balances for FY2021 were +14%; adjusted net estimated unrestricted spending available year-end FY2021 is \$265,000+/-; an increase of nearly \$265,000+/- from budget.
  - o FY2020 revenues came in slightly higher, and FY2020 expenditures came in lower than estimated during the budget process.
- Through April 2021, 32.8% of budgeted revenues and 33.8% of budgeted expenditures have been realized.

#### Sewer Fund – 35:

- Beginning balances for FY2021 were nearly the same as budgeted; estimated unrestricted spending available year-end FY2021 is \$3,500+/-, only slightly adjusted as budgeted.
  - FY2020 revenues and expenditures came in slightly higher than estimated during the budget process.
- Through April 2021, 30.8% of budgeted revenues and 29.2% of budgeted expenditures have been realized.

#### Ambulance Fund – 40:

- Beginning balances for FY2021 were +139%; adjusted net estimated unrestricted spending available year-end FY2021 is \$87,800+/-; an increase of nearly \$84,000+/- from budget.
  - o FY2020 revenues came in higher, and FY2020 expenditures came in slightly lower than estimated during the budget process.
- Through April 2021, 35.1% of budgeted revenues and 33.7% of budgeted expenditures have been realized.

#### Lee C Fine Airport Fund – 45:

- Beginning balances for FY2021 were +123%; adjusted net estimated unrestricted spending available year-end FY2021 is \$171,000+/-; an increase of nearly \$167,000+/- from budget.
  - FY2020 revenues came in higher, and FY2020 expenditures came in lower than estimated during the budget process. This is mainly due to the timing of grant projects and direct related grants funding.
- Through April 2021, 4.2% of budgeted revenues and 3.2% of budgeted expenditures have been realized.

### **Grand Glaize Airport Fund – 47:**

- Beginning balances for FY2021 were +31%; adjusted net estimated unrestricted spending available year-end FY2021 is \$21,400+/-; an increase of nearly \$19,000+/- from budget.
  - FY2020 expenditures came in lower than estimated during the budget process.
- Through April 2021, 19.9% of budgeted revenues and 27.0% of budgeted expenditures have been realized.

Component Units – Prewitt's Point TIF and the Dierbergs TIF Funds: The unrestricted funds net cash and equivalent availability for both TIF Funds were unchanged as funding for both flow through to pay respective debt service. Both funds experienced higher FY2020 revenues directly due to the increase in sales tax collection within the respective districts.

#### **Fund Reserves**

In 2017, the Board of Aldermen adopted the City's first Reserve Policy establishing fund reserves and specific target levels of reserves based on O&M averages and capital expenditures calculations for the General Fund, Transportation Fund, Water Fund, Sewer Fund, Lee C Fine Fund, and the Grand Glaize Fund.

The following are budgeted FY2021 and year-end estimated reserve levels post FY2020 audit draft.

#### **Debt Service Reconciliation**

The enclosed is an update on the City's Outstanding Debt with future year forecasting based on the current amortization schedules.

Based on past conversations with the Mayor and Board of Aldermen, there was interest in further conversations regarding any opportunities for us to pay debt off early to save on debt service costs.

### Addition notes regarding Debt Service:

- Budget reflects debt service per amortization schedules. Actual bond payments occur prior to scheduled due dates. For example, bond due dates of January 1 (beginning of our fiscal year), cash payments will occur in prior fiscal year. All water and sewer bonds have a semi-annual payment schedules, January and July. 2020 TIF has a semi-annual payment schedule of May and November.
- 2) Water and sewer bonds may be called for full redemption and payment prior to maturity without consent of the bondholder on either by June 1 or December 1, plus accrued interest to the redemption date (per bond documents). An estimated minimum Sixty-day (60) notice to MoDNR is needed for such full redemption. For example, if intent is to fully redeem a bond on June 1 (prior to a July scheduled payment), notice to MoDNR would be needed no later than April 1. Further confirmation of timelines will be determined if such decision is made on a specific bond. Partial redemptions require consent of bondholder, additional notice to MoDNR (should said consent be given), and formal recalculations of amortization schedules by bondholder will be required; additional cost associated with partial redemption will apply.
- 3) Water and sewer bonds have a Debt Service Reserve Fund requirement. The final year for payment, any said reserves (if required to be held in the CIT Fund) are utilized for bond redemption. Each bond varies in said requirement.
- 4) Based on current sales tax collection activity and should said activity remain constant, the 2020 TIF Bonds are expected to pay off prior to FY2023.
