As City staff continues to prepare for the upcoming FY2022 Operating Budget, the City's financial situation remains positive as it has all year. Sales tax collections and other revenue sources remain up over last year and capital investment into our City for the current year continue on schedule, with many projects completed. The City's cash reserves are healthy and on target with the City's reserve policy, a key attribute of a financially stable organization. A strong reserve position allows the City to weather economic downturns, manage changes in revenue flows, maintain the capital needs of the departments, and to effectively address unexpected emergencies.

We are dedicated to being good stewards of our community and will continue to operate efficiently to deliver superior municipal services to our citizens and visitors.

From the Police Department:

During the month of September, the Osage Beach Police Department will have additional officers on the road conducting traffic enforcement activities. They will be focusing on Hazardous Moving Violations and Driving While Intoxicated Offenses. Our Goal is to reduce traffic crashes and increase the safety of our residents and visitors on our roadways.

RSMO 302.022 – If you are approaching a stationary vehicle displaying lighted red or red and blue lights or a stationary vehicle displaying amber or amber and white lights, the driver of every vehicle shall:

Proceed with caution and yield the right of way, by making a lane change into a lane not adjacent to the stationary vehicle or proceed with caution and reduce the speed of the vehicle, maintaining a safe speed for road conditions, if changing lanes would be unsafe.

The City of Osage Beach urges residents to only flush toilet paper. Disinfecting wipes and other items should be properly disposed of in the trash, not the toilet. These wipes and other items do not break down in sewer or septic systems and can damage your home's internal plumbing as well as our wastewater collection system. As a result, flushing these wipes can clog your toilet and/or create sewage backups into your home or your neighborhood. Additionally, these wipes can cause significant damage to pipes, pumps, and other wastewater treatment equipment. Disinfecting wipes, baby wipes, and paper towels should NEVER be flushed. 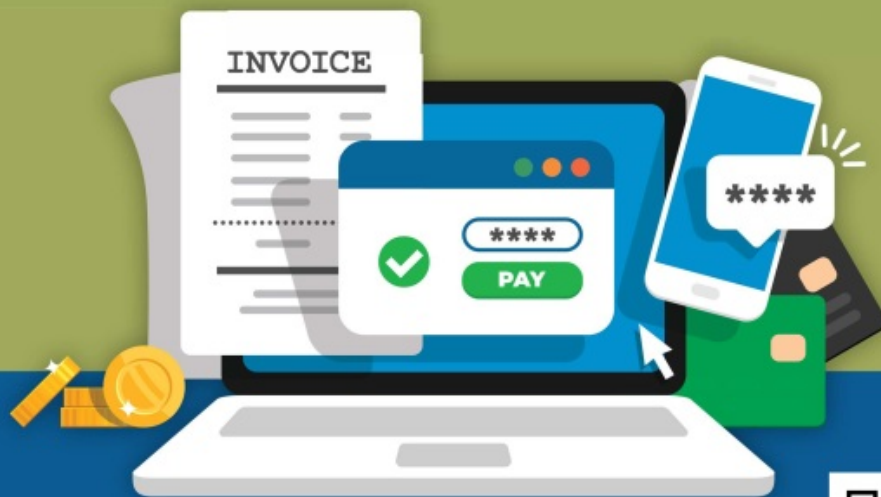
