They have been holding this session annually since 2017 to outline their long-term vision and priorities to provide clear direction for better decision making. Be employed while attending Academy!



The City of Osage Beach is excited to announce its new Police Officer Recruit program. This program will invest in the future of qualified candidates by sponsoring Police Officer Recruits in a police academy and providing career opportunities. Successful individuals are those who have proven communication skills, demonstrated integrity, have a passion for service and caring for the community, and have taken initiative to gain higher education.

The starting salary for the Police Officer Recruit position is \$30,000 annually, paid on an hourly basis with benefits. Upon completion of a Police Academy and receiving P.O.S.T. certification, recruits will be promoted to the position of Police Officer. Police Officer starting salary is \$36,014 with a \$1.50 per hour shift differential pay, and uniforms are fully covered. After graduation, new officers will be placed in a Field Training Officer Program for 12 weeks. From this point on, officers work 12-hour shifts, 7:00 AM to 7:00 PM or 7:00 PM to 7:00 AM.

From the Police Department



With all the recent Bear sightings in the area recently we thought we would talk about what you should do if you encounter a Bear near your home or business.

LEAVE THE BEAR ALONE AND GIVE IT SPACE TO LEAVE ON ITS OWN.

Contact your local Conservation Office or Law Enforcement

Remain calm and get to a safe place, such as in a house, business, or a car. (Not up a tree because Bears can climb trees)

DO NOT Approach the Bear. Give it as much space as possible

Encourage the Bear to leave the area by making loud noises, such as banging pots and pans and yelling

When its safe to do so, remove all food attractants from the property

Never feed a bear, either intentionally or unintentionally. Bears will eat out of Trash Cans, BBQ Grills, Birdfeeders, Horse Feed, Chicken Feed, Pet Food, Fruit Trees, etc.

Osage Beach Police Department wins Boots & Badges Blood Drive!


The Community Blood Center of the Ozarks partnered with Osage Beach first responders in hosting the Boots and Badges blood drive.


