Comments from your City Administrator Jeana L. Woods, CPA, ICMA-CM

The City is nearly six months into our fiscal year and things are looking very positive! Financially, the City has expended 34% of our \$29.4 million operating budget for FY2021 and has collected 35% of budgeted revenues. Sales Tax revenue represents a large portion of the City's reoccurring revenue source, 48% in the FY2021 operating budget. Fees & Service Charges represent 30% of projected FY2021 revenue. One-time source grants and other one-time reimbursements, mostly tied to capital projects, represent the remainder of incoming revenues in FY2021.

Through June 2021, Sales Tax collections are impressively 25% more than FY2020 receipts for the same period! Last year did present unprecedented times as the City and our community was faced with the COVID-19 pandemic. However, we responded in a fiscally sound manner and ended FY2020 financially in good shape, with Sales Tax collection on target and up over 3% from FY2019. Historically, the City will collect over 58% of the year's Sales Taxes in the last 6 months of the year, so our busiest months are ahead.

The FY2021 operating budget outlines over \$7 million of capital investment into the community and includes mainly airport, transportation, water, and sewer system projects. Some of these projects are carryovers from delays for FY2020 due to the pandemic. Projects already completed include the intersection safety improvements at Osage Beach Parkway and Beach Drive and the Passover Water Tower cleaning. Other projects will begin soon, including the final stage of the Mace Road improvements and the apron reconstruction at Lee C Fine Airport.

I hope you find value in the City's newsletter. In addition, the City provides a lot of information on our **website**, including Board meeting activity, official City statements, and my office's report to the Board of Aldermen each month which can be found **HERE**.

Be employed while attending Academy!



The City of Osage Beach is excited to announce its new Police Officer Recruit program. This program will invest in the future of qualified candidates by sponsoring Police Officer Recruits in a police academy and providing career opportunities. Successful individuals are those who have proven communication skills, demonstrated integrity, have a passion for service and caring for the community, and have taken initiative to gain higher education.

The starting salary for the Police Officer Recruit position is \$30,000 annually, paid on an hourly basis with benefits. Upon completion of a Police Academy and receiving P.O.S.T. certification, recruits will be promoted to the position of Police Officer. Police Officer starting salary is \$36,014 with a \$1.50 per hour shift differential pay, and uniforms are fully covered. After graduation, new officers will be placed in a Field Training Officer Program for 12 weeks. From this point on, officers work 12-hour shifts, 7:00 AM to 7:00 PM or 7:00 PM to 7:00 AM.

Time for BACKFLOW Inspections



Pursuant to Missouri DNR Drinking Water Program regulations, **most** customers of public water systems are required to have and maintain backflow assemblies on water lines. This includes irrigation systems and dock-supplied water lines. The City of Osage Beach, as the supplier, must insure the safety of our potable water supply. Backflow devices must be tested, **once per year**, by a Certified Backflow Inspector. Courtesy advance notification letters are sent by the Osage Beach Department of Public Works prior to the testing anniversary date. If you have any questions, please call Public Works at 302-2020 or come by and pick up a DNR information sheet. You can also log onto www.dnr.mo.gov and click on Water Protection Program.

Happy Independence Day Sunday, July 4th

As the fireworks tents start popping up all over it is a sure sign that the 4h of July holiday is fast approaching. This is a friendly reminder that it is NOT legal to discharge fireworks within the city limits of Osage Beach without a permit.

A permit may be obtained from the City to allow discharging of fireworks within the city limits. The permit may be downloaded at www.osagebeach-mo.gov or obtained from the City Clerks Office at City Hall.

Remember that fireworks can be dangerous and cause severe burns and eye injuries.. You can prevent fireworks related injuries and deaths by following these safety tips:

- Never allow young children to play with or ignite fireworks.
- Avoid buying fireworks that are packaged in brown paper because this is often a sign that the
 fireworks were made for a professional display.
- Always have an adult supervise fireworks activities.
- Never place any part of your body directly over a fireworks device when lighting the fuse.
 Back up to a safe distance immediately after lighting.
- Never try to rel-light a fireworks that have not fully ignited.
- Never point or throw fireworks at another person.
- Keep a bucket of water or a garden hose handy in case of a fire or other mishap.
- Light fireworks one at a time then move away quickly.
- Never carry fireworks in a pocket or shoot them off in a metal or glass container.
- After fireworks complete their burning, douse them with water before disposing in the trash to avoid a trash fire.
- Make sure fireworks are legal in your area before buying or discharging them.

Call Before You Burn! 573-365-6407

As many of us begin spending more time outdoors during the summer months, we must keep in mind

the importance of fire safety and local burn regulations. Before igniting any outdoor fire / open burn, be sure to check with the Osage Beach Fire Protection District about the potential requirement for a burn permit. Remember, you must call each day you intend to burn.

The burn number is 573-365-6407

According to the City of Osage Beach and Osage Beach Fire Protection District guidelines, the following is a list of requirements that must be met in order to ensure a safe burn:

- 1. The wind must be below 10 miles per hour.
 - 2. Humidity must be above 30%.
- 3. The temperature must be below 95 degrees Fahrenheit.
- 4. The fire must be attended at all times. The person must have a hose and rake with them to attend to the fire.
- 5. You can only burn yard waste. This includes leaves, branches, and untreated wood. Do not burn treated wood (chemically, painted, varnished, etc.), household trash, rubbish, waste, or refuse, including plastics or other hydrocarbons.
 - 6. The fire must be out by dark.
- 7. You must call for a burn permit on the day you wish to burn. You cannot call to request a permit the day before you plan to burn.
- 8. When Red Flag conditions are announced by National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA), or the Missouri State Fire Marshal's office issues a statewide burn ban, these will supersede requirements 1, 2, and 3 above.
 - 9. Subjects are responsible for their controlled burn.
 - 10. Fires must be at least 25 feet away from any structure.

In most instances, recreational fires and fires used for cooking purposes are exempt from permit requirement. However, if you have any questions or concerns, call 573-365-6407 before you burn.






