The City also received The James Farrell Award of Excellence, named in honor of former St. Louis ASA/USA Softball Commissioner and National Office Staff member James Farrell. To receive the award, host cities must do an outstanding job of hosting ASA/USA Softball National Championship Tournaments and must receive an overall rating of 95% from the ASA/USA Softball Representative, Umpire-In-Chief and National Office. The City of Osage Beach hosted two tournaments in 2020 and teams from across the country came to Osage Beach to participate.

In addition to Local Government Week, we are also recognizing National Police Week, Municipal Clerk Week, National Volunteer Week, National Travel and Tourism Week, and National Small Business Week, all recognized at various times in April and May 2021. Osage Beach is committed to providing superior municipal services, a safe and appealing place to live and conduct business, as well as growing our premier visitor destination. Next time you relax in the park, feel safe and secure, drink a glass of water, drive on a snow-plowed street, or if you just love your community, pause and consider your local government!


Be employed while attending Academy!



The City of Osage Beach is excited to announce its new Police Officer Recruit program. This program will invest in the future of qualified candidates by sponsoring Police Officer Recruits in a police academy and providing career opportunities. Successful individuals are those who have proven communication skills, demonstrated integrity, have a passion for service and caring for the community, and have taken initiative to gain higher education.

The starting salary for the Police Officer Recruit position is \$30,000 annually, paid on an hourly basis with benefits. Upon completion of a Police Academy and receiving P.O.S.T. certification, recruits will be promoted to the position of Police Officer. Police Officer starting salary is \$36,014 with a \$1.50 per hour shift differential pay, and uniforms are fully covered. After graduation, new officers will be placed in a Field Training Officer Program for 12 weeks. From this point on, officers work 12-hour shifts, 7:00 AM to 7:00 PM or 7:00 PM to 7:00 AM.




