Liquor License Renewals

All liquor license currently in effect or any renewals offered or applied for in accordance with Section 600.165 Osage Beach Municipal Code are hereby extended for two months.

For example, any license renewal due on May 1, 2020 is now due July 1, 2020 and all periods for penalties for late renewals are similarly extended.

Fiscal year 2020 liquor licenses that are set to expire on June 30, 2020 will now extend until August 31, 2020. This is an extension of the current active license.

Municipal Clerks Week

May 3-9, 2020



This May, Municipal Clerks Week will be celebrating its 51st Anniversary. Initiated in 1969 by International Institute Municipal Clerks and endorsed by all its members throughout the United States, Canada and 15 other countries, the week is a time of celebration and reflection on the importance of the Clerk's office.

In 1984, President Ronald Reagan signed a proclamation that officially declared Municipal Clerks Week the first full week of May. In 1994 and 1996, President Bill Clinton also signed proclamations confirming Municipal Clerks Week.

Municipal and Deputy Clerks' main function is to serve as the Board of Aldermen's foundation. Other duties include, but are not limited to preparing agendas, taking minutes, maintaining ordinance and resolutions files, keeping the municipality's historical records, processing permits and serving as the clearinghouse for information about the local government.

They also record the actions of the various commissions and committees appointed by the Aldermen. Many serve as financial officers or treasurers and, in small municipalities, may act as the chief administrative officers. Another important responsibility is administering part or all the local election functions.

Severe Weather Tips from the Osage Beach Police Department Office of Emergency Management

The Osage Beach Police Department along with the National Weather Service and the State Emergency Management Agency urges everyone to learn about severe weather and how to protect themselves during severe weather. Please take the time and remind your family, friends, and co-workers to review the emergency plans for the various locations that they could be throughout their day so that when the warnings are activated they know what to do, and where to go to seek safety.

Some information to remember :

Listen to radio, television, or weather radios for weather reports and emergency information

"If Thunder Roars, Move Indoors" no place outside is safe from lightning, stay indoors for at least 30 minutes after the last clap of thunder

Get inside a vehicle, home or building

Unplug appliances or other electrical devices. They can be severely damaged from lightning strikes

A Tornado Watch mean the conditions are favorable for tornados in the area

A Tornado Warning means seek shelter immediately because a tornado has been sighted or indicated by radar .

The safest shelter is located in an interior room without windows on the lowest floor

Overpasses are not safe. Their designs can cause a wind tunnel effect that could cause you to be sucked out from underneath them

If you are driving, drive away from the tornado to the closest building. If you cannot get away stay in your car, remain in your seatbelt and protect yourself from flying debris

Do NOT drive into water that is over the road. **"Turn Around, Don't Drown."** It takes less than six inches of fast moving water to move a car

There are no designated storm shelters located within the City of Osage Beach. Citizens may come to City Hall for shelter in the lower level of City Hall during tornado warnings. We will accommodate the social distancing during the COVID-19 Pandemic.

In 1962 President John F. Kennedy signed a proclamation designating May 15 as Peace Officers Memorial Day and the week in which that date falls as Police Week. During this time law enforcement officers across the country pay tribute to those officers who have made the ultimate sacrifice.

The largest of the events take place in Washington D.C. at the National Law Enforcement Memorial, however there are events that take place at the state and local levels across the nation.

Locally, we have a Lake Area Emergency Services Memorial which is located next to the Osage Beach Fire Protection District Headquarters at 1170 Bluff Drive Osage Beach. This memorial honors those lake area emergency responders that gave the ultimate sacrifice.
