Are you StormAware?

StormAware means you and your family know how to protect yourselves in the event of a tornado or severe weather, aware of weather forecast and monitor severe watches and warnings. You have developed a plan for you and your family for home, work, school, and when outdoors.

It's important to remember, tornadoes develop in areas where a severe thunderstorm watch, or warning is in effect, so listen for this information as well. <u>Tornado Watch</u> – possibility of tornadoes. Remain alert for approaching storms. <u>Tornado Warning</u> – sighted or indicated by weather radar. Move to your pre-designated place of safety. March through May is considered peak tornado weather in our area.

Missouri's 2019 statewide tornado drill will be held on Tuesday, March 5, 2019 at 10 a.m.

Preparing before severe weather:

- Develop a plan for you and your family for home, work, relatives or friend's homes. Listen to radio, television or NOAA weather radio for information. Know children's school and daycare emergency plans as well as dismissal policy. Make sure everyone understands warning siren systems.

- Have an emergency kit. Teach family how to administer basic first aid, use a fire extinguisher and how to turn off water, gas and electricity in your home.

- During storm or tornadoes

 In a home or building, move to a pre-designated shelter, such as a basement.

 If an underground shelter is not available, move to an interior room or hallway on the lowest floor, and get under a sturdy piece of furniture.

 Stay away from windows.

 Get out of automobiles.

 Do not use a highway overpass as shelter.

 Do not try to outrun a tornado in your car; instead, leave it immediately.

 If caught outside or in a vehicle, lie flat in a nearby ditch or depression.

 Manufactured (mobile) homes, even if tied down, offer little protection from tornadoes and should be abandoned.

 Keep the following items in a container that or easily carried.

Keep the following items in a container that can be

- Water and canned or dried food
- Battery powered radio
- Flashlight Extra batteries for the radio and flashlight
- Prescription medications
- First-aid kit

BACKFLOW

Inspections Information

Pursuant to Missouri Department of Natural Resources Drinking Water Program regulations, certain customers of public water systems are required to have and maintain backflow assemblies on water lines. This includes irrigation systems and dock-supplied water lines. The City of Osage Beach, as the supplier, must insure the safety of our potable water supply. All backflow devices must be tested, once per year, by a Certified Backflow Inspector. Courtesy advance notification letters are sent out, to the mailing address on file with the City, by the Osage Beach Department of Public Works prior to the testing anniversary date. Overdue letters are sent as a second reminder. Remember, it is the home/ business owners responsibility to make sure the City has a copy of your yearly test. According to City ordinances, these are the only contacts you will receive before your water is shut off. You will then have a reconnection fee after we receive your current backflow test. Please, if you have any questions, give Public Works a call at 302-2020 ext. 2010, or come by and pick up a DNR information sheet. You can also log onto www.dnr.mo.gov and click on Water Protection Program.
