From the Mayor, Board of Aldermen and Staff



Comments from your City Administrator Jeana L. Woods, CPA

The Osage Beach Planning and Zoning Commission and the Board of Aldermen recently passed updated zoning regulations pertaining to a new industry recognized by the State of Missouri – Medical Marijuana, now Article XIV of the Missouri Constitution. The City began preparations a few months ago, beginning with a public forum, to address the needed changes to the zoning code to accommodate the new regulations of this industry, ahead of the State application process. Zoning updates included where establishments dispensing, manufacturing, cultivation, or testing can be placed within the City.

The next step for the City is to review additional code updates as it pertains to law enforcement, building codes and nuisance, and employment. The City has approached this topic proactively with an emphasis in transparency, and in an effort to stay ahead of the State's various deadlines.

Did you know that the Osage Beach Police Department participates in several different National Highway Traffic Safety Campaigns each year? Currently we are working on our Hazardous Moving and DWI Enforcement grants. We receive funds from the Missouri Department of Transportation, Division of Highway Safety for overtime enforcement activities. Statistics show that the number of accidents in Osage Beach increase between May and October each year. During this time period we staff an additional officer during peak hours for traffic enforcement.

During our enforcement periods you will see additional officers patrolling the roadways conducting traffic enforcement. The officers will be paying special attention to Hazardous Moving Violations such as Following to Close, Red Light Violations, Stop Sign Violations, Speeding, Fail to Yield, Impaired Driving, along with Seat Belt Violations.

Osage Beach is one of approximately sixty municipalities or counties in Missouri that have a Primary Seat Belt Ordinance. This means that Officers can stop you for not wearing your seat belt. They do not need another violation to stop you. If they see you're not wearing your seat belt, you may be stopped and ticketed for that as well.

Our overall goal is to make Osage Beach a safe place for everyone.

We encourage everyone to join the City staff in the Buckle Up, Phone Down challenge. Wear your seat belt and put your phone down when operating a motor vehicle so that you can keep your eyes on the road and avoid any hazards that may pop up along your route.

We want everyone to get to their destinations safely.

SUPPORT FOR PARKS & RECREATION

- 92% of Americans agree parks and recreation departments are important local government services.
- 85% of Americans seek high-quality parks and recreation amenities when they are choosing a new place to live.
- Parks provide gathering places for families and social groups, as well as for individuals, regardless of their ability to pay for access.

HEALTH BENEFITS

- On average, children who live in greener environments weigh less.
- Living close to parks is consistently related to higher physical activity levels for adults and youth.
- Trust for Public Land provides strong evidence that people exercise more when they have access to parks.
- Regular physical activity can improve health and reduce the risk of disease such as heart disease, hypertension, colon cancer, and diabetes.

ENVIRONMENTAL BENEFITS

- A park with one acre of trees absorbs the carbon dioxide produced by driving a car 11,000 miles.
- Parks reduce the impact of large storms and flooding by soaking up run off from nearby paved surfaces. This prevents flooding and damages.
- Park facilities conserve natural resources and wildlife habitat, protect air and water quality, and preserve open space for current and future generations.

ECONOMIC BENEFITS

- America's local and regional park agencies generated nearly \$140 billion in economic activity and supported almost 1 million jobs from their operations and capital spending alone in 2013.
- Public parks increase property value adjacent to parks by 20%.
- Parks can attract consumers to nearby regions, spur the opening of local restaurants, and increase tourism.

SOCIAL & EQUITY BENEFITS

- Public parks provide equal access to all citizens regardless of age, gender, ethnicity or ability.
- Parks and rec facilities can foster community pride, bring people together

- Parks and recreation facilities can foster community pride, bring people together, and connect people to each other and nature.
- Communities are safer as a result of a wholesome atmosphere created by well-managed parks and recreation services in communities through healthy activities and programming for all people.
