Recent Board Meeting Highlights:

- Entered into an Intergovernmental agreement with Camden County for the Three Seasons Overlay Project
- Amending regulations involving Liquor Sales on Sundays removing requirement for some establishments the need to have 50% food sales; this matches State of Missouri requirements
- Awarded Phase I Mace Rd Reconstruction to Donald Maggi Inc
- Awarded Phase II Lee C Fine Taxiway Reconstruction to Lehman Construction for 2019

Comments from your City Administrator Jeanne L. Woods, CPA

It is hard to believe it is summer time and the year is half way through!

Although the mid-year budget report will be completed shortly after June 30th, as of the end of May the City has collected approximately 37% of all revenues as projected and expended 34% as projected in the FY2018 Budget. Sales Tax represents a majority of the City's revenue source and as of May it is just \$50,000 shy of FY2018 projections to date. Historically, the months within the second half of the year are the best for the City regarding sales tax collection!

Many City projects represented in the FY2018 Budget are being worked on or have been recently completed. One long anticipated project is the Mace Road Reconstruction. This two-part project is underway and is a total reconstruction of Mace Road that will carry over into 2019. The Osage Beach Parkway westside sealcoat and striping project is complete with the eastside

of the Parkway to follow in the upcoming months. The Three Seasons Road overlay project is an intergovernmental agreement with Camden County which will be completed this month, as will the Grand Glaize Sealcoat and Holdsign Construction project. There are many other projects and activities going on in many of the departments, as all the departments within our municipal government are essential in building our community and providing superior municipal service!

We are dedicated to being good stewards of our community and will continue to operate efficiently to deliver superior municipal services to our citizens and visitors. Please do not hesitate to contact me with questions or comments.

SERVICE LINE WARRANTIES OF AMERICA PARTNERS WITH OSAGE BEACH



The City of Osage Beach has partnered with Service Line Warranties of America (SLWA) to offer optional coverage to help eligible homeowners be prepared in case sewer/septic lines were to suffer a leak, break or clog from your utility's point of maintenance to your home.

In the event of an emergency, these plans can save homeowners a significant amount of money. Please take the time to read the information on the back of the letter you will receive.

We certainly hope that you never have an exterior water service or sewer/septic line emergency, but if you should ever have a problem, you'll be glad you're covered. These programs are managed by SLWA, not the City of Osage Beach.

In an effort to reduce traffic crashes the Osage Beach Police Department will have increased patrols out this summer looking for Aggressive and Impaired Drivers. We want to ensure that our citizens and visitors have a safe and enjoyable summer.

Missouri's Move Over law requires drivers to approach cautiously when an emergency vehicle displaying red or red and blue lights or a vehicle owned by the state highways and transportation commission displaying lighted amber or amber and white lights is stopped along the side of the road. Motorists must change lanes away from the emergency vehicle if they are on a multi-lane highway and can SAFELY do so. If drivers can't change lanes safely, or they are on a two-lane highway, they must slow down while maintaining a safe speed so as not to impede other traffic
