1/4 MILE NEW HIKING AND BIKING TRAIL COMING TO OSAGE BEACH CITY PARK

Osage Beach Parks and Recreation Department -City of Osage Beach, Missouri is partnering with Missouri State Parks and Magic Dragon Trails to build a 2-mile multi-use single track trail connecting City Park to Lake of the Ozarks State Park.

Designed for hiking and mountain biking, this is the first step in a plan to develop 70 miles of world-class trails in the region.

Construction begins late 2025, with a grand opening set for Spring 2026. Thanks to our amazing volunteers, local leaders, and partners for making this vision a reality!

This is the latest in a series of projects to improve Osage Beach City Park, including a new disc golf course, revitalized sand volleyball courts, and improved roads.

If crime shows have you thinking evidence rooms are like open buffets—cops waltzing in to grab a bloody glove or shady baggie before heading to court with a dramatic flourish—think again. That's not how things work in Osage Beach.

"They always show officers walking into evidence rooms by themselves and getting evidence out. Then, in some shows, thefts are happening," said Jennifer Winchester, Osage Beach Police Department Evidence Custodian.

"We don't allow that here. I'm the only one allowed in the evidence room."

Winchester is the gatekeeper of everything from DNA swabs to stolen bikes, methamphetamines to money, and once, even human ashes.

"That was definitely the weirdest," she said.


